We are a committee of the student body, which as an executive is responsible for the current business and implements the decisions of the student parliament (StuPa).

The AStA is elected by the students' parliament and consists of four executive committees and a number of advisors, who are appointed by the executive committees for various areas of responsibility. The Hessian Higher Education Act stipulates that we support you in higher education policy, social and cultural matters. We represent the students' interests towards the university and the public. In addition to the representation of interests, the consultation and support of students is our main field of activity. For this purpose, we offer consultation hours on social issues (financing studies, studying with a child, housing, etc.) or on questions of mobility (semester ticket), examination and study regulations and many other topics, which we present in detail on the following pages. SEMESTER FEE WINTER SEMESTER 21/22

The semester fee this semester is 373.30 euros for first-year students and 363.30 euros for students in the higher semesters. The amount is made up of 7 items, with the semester ticket making up the majority. The lowest cost items are the liability insurance with 0.1%, the hardship regulation with 0.3%, and the share for the AStA with 2.7%.

All students automatically pay for the RMV semester ticket with their semester fee. In return, the electronic student ID (study chip) is valid as a ticket for the entire semester

Improve your studies and stay in contact with other students? The Department of Higher Education Policy deals with all tasks related to internal higher education policy (on campus), as well as external higher education policy (off campus). This includes advising the Board of Directors, initiating and implementing projects and processes, drawing up bylaws and regulations, planning and implementing events, and participating in other departments.

In principle, four areas can be distinguished: as already described, internal and external university policy, which is further subdivided internally into academic (university) and student self-administration. Externally, there are also own projects and initiatives beyond the campus borders apart from the institutional work with associations, federations and other student organizations The e.g. most extensive cross-linking in Hessen on the part of the student body exists between ASten, the so-called "LandesASten conference" (LAK).

PSYCHOSOCIAL COACHING

Are you facing a difficult decision and don't know how to proceed? Is the stress growing over your head and you feel overwhelmed? Are there conflicts or crises in or with your environment where you just don't know what to do?Get in touch and make an appointment for social coaching!

Coaching in everyday life at university and in life questions means to reflect on one's own problem, to increasingly understand it, to find a solution and to recognize how the longed-for state should look like. Knowing one's own strengths and being able to use resources are decisive steps in this process. Together we can recognize, plan and follow the path to a solution.

COOPERATION

Social coaching also cooperates with other institutions and can be used as a contact point for information and further mediation. In addition, workshops on current topics are organized at irregular intervals in cooperation with specialists (announcement via Internet, notices, etc.). The first step in a new direction can be to find a Counselling center.

CORE AREAS OF CONSULTING

DECISION-MAKING PROCESSES

Together we try to look at your problem from different perspectives in order to broaden the scope of thought and action.

STRESS MANAGEMENT, SELF MANAGEMENT AND ORGANIZATION

Examination phase = difficult phase, we look for individual approaches to structuring and develop first aid tips for you in case of acute motivation lows.

INTERPERSONAL CONFLICTS

We change the perspective and together we examine the conflict. Anyone who wants to study successfully and cope with everyday life has to face many challenges and show stamina.

The multi-dimensional loads cause many students to suffer under severe pressure. At the beginning of their studies it is not easy to understand the structures, later on, partly caused by stress and fears, seemingly insurmountable study demands arise.

Financial hardships, mobbing or other life tasks also cause and increase

the pressure and burdens. The life satisfaction and the well-being are strongly reduced, the self-esteem often highly shaken. If you are looking for advice on these or other topics, the social aspect could be the right place for you.

SOCIAL COUNSELLING

Have you got into serious difficulties for reasons such as personal conflicts, psychological problems, financial difficulties, health problems or loss of accommodation and/or job? difficulties?

Is your situation getting too much for you?

The AStA's social counselling service can support you and help you to help you to improve the general conditions of your studies as much as possible and to relieve some of the pressure on you.

The social counselling service can help you with questions about:

- Financing options
- Finding a place to live and being without a place to live



TIP: After an interruption of 15 minutes, the free rental process can be repeated

NEXTBIKE

Since the summer semester 2018 there is a nextbike station on campus directly at the Rote Haus and in the near vicinity there are more rental spots where you can rent bikes for free. Students of Frankfurt University of Applied Sciences cycle at special rates.

THIS MEANS FOR YOU:

- Free travel time of up to 60 minutes for each rental
- Free lending of up to three bikes at the same time possible
- After a break of 15 minutes you can rent a next bike for free

If the free volume is exceeded, you will be charged!

Borrow via app, hotline or enter your cell phone number and 6-digit PIN into the BikeComputer

- Enter lock code on the bike computer and press "ok" key
- Open the fork lock, insert it into the holder on the basket and cycle off

Return only to official nextbike stations (see App)

- Push the fork lock through the front fork and the stand until it engages
- Press the "ok" button on the bike computer and wait until the return is confirmed with a signal
- Station full? Lock the bike next to a station and confirm the return by bike computer
- Parking: Press the "P" button on the bike computer

You can find the nextbike station and the rental spots in the surrounding area on the map on page 1 of the info booklet. In total there are more than **140 stations** in Frankfurt - and new ones are constantly being added. You can also use this offer in other cities, it is valid **nationwide**!

Bike Sharing mit Nextbike



- Students who, after confirmation by the examination office, have fulfilled the requirements for registering for the final examination and whose place of residence and actual place of residence is outside the RMV area

For a refund of the semester ticket, an application must be submitted in the Semesterticket Office. You can find this application on the AStA homepage, under the section Semesterticket Office. The application as well as all necessary proof must be submitted within the deadline for the semester (four weeks after the start of lectures). In the case of reimbursement for health reasons, the application for the valid deadline can be submitted no later than four weeks after the beginning of the following semester.

Committees are the self-governing bodies of the university.

A public university is not organized "from the higher ups"! With a few exceptions, all decisions are made in the committees that represent the groups involved. In principle, four areas can be distinguished:

STUDENT SELF-GOVERNMENT

Committees consisting only of students (StuPa, AStA & Student councils).

ACADEMIC SELF-GOVERNMENT

Committees consisting of: students, professors and staff members (Presidium, Senate, Dean's office, department councils and exam committees)

There are committees at department levels.

For example:

- Study contents and organization
- Hiring of professors
- Creation and updating of degree programs

And committees at university level.


For example:

- decisions which concern all degree programs and faculties (legal, financial, personnel, etc.)
- Strategic orientation of the university
- Framework for the faculties

The students are the numerically largest group of the university. The student self-determination is in the Hessian Higher Education Act (HHG) - this allows us in many ways to help shape the university and enforce our interests.

STUDENT PARLIAMENT (STUPA)

The Student Parliament (StuPa) is the highest decision-making body of all registered students at our university (i.e. the constituted student body). There are 25 seats for student parliamentarians, who are elected by the students.

The elections take place in the winter semester together with the elections for the university committees (Senate, Departmental Council, Student Council). In the StuPa, university policy and other topics relevant to the students are discussed and democratically negotiated. However, the StuPa also elects, for example, the board of the General Students' Committee (AStA), advises and approves the budget and appoints other committees such as the Hardship Committee and the Audit Committee. In addition, the StuPa elects a presidium from the ranks of the female parliamentarians, which is responsible for ensuring that the meetings are conducted properly and that the parliament fullfils the tasks set forth in the StuPa's statutes.

The StuPa sessions usually take place monthly during the lecture period and are open to the university, so you are all welcome to attend! The invitations as well as the minutes are posted on the StuPa boards in the different buildings. You can also keep up to date on dates and agenda items on the Facebook page of the student parliament.

GENERAL STUDENT COMMITTEE (ASTA)

The General Student Committee conducts the business of the of the student body. It represents student interests vis-à-vis the university and the public. It also implements the decisions of the student parliament.

Among other things, it organises cultural events (e.g. the summer festival), conducts negotiations with contractual partners (e.g. RMV) and actively promotes the interests of students in internal and external university politics. All students who are interested in the work of the AStA can contact the staff in the Red House office at any time. Student Representative Councils

The student councils represent the interests of the students in their departments. They are primarily concerned with the content and organisation of the degree programmes. They are the interface to the administration (deaneries and departmental councils). They bring together students' problems, propose solutions and try to mediate in cases of conflict.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE COUNCILS

Each department has its own student council. Students from the respective department organise themselves in these student councils and volunteer their time to improve the conditions of study, e.g. with regard to the organisation of the courses offered. They also organise information events, such as the first-year introductions and general assemblies, and organise parties, social evenings and much more.

STUDENT COUNCILS

Each department has its own student council. Some members of the student council also work in committees such as the AStA, StuPa, Senate, Student Council, Examination Board and other committees and commissions, where they represent the interests of the students. COMMITTEES OF ACADEMIC SELF-GOVERMENT

The university is largely self-governing. Important decisions on research, teaching and studies are made in the central and decentralized committees of the university. This is limited by the Hessian Higher Education Act (HHG) and the Higher Education Framework Act (HRG). Of course, students are also represented here!

SENATE

The Senate is the highest body of the university. It advises in matters of research, teaching and studies that affect the entire university or are of fundamental importance and is composed of 17 university members, 5 of whom are students:

- 9 professors
- 5 students
- 1 academic staff
- 2 administrative-technical staff

The members of the Presidential Board, the Women's and Equal Opportunities Representative, the Representative for Severely Disabled Persons, and the Chairperson of the General Students' Committee and the Staff Council are members of the Senate of Frankfurt University of Applied Sciences in an advisory capacity. The Senate is chaired by the President.

PRESIDIUM

The Presidium is responsible for all matters that are not assigned by law to another body. It directs the university, promotes its timely internal and external development with the participation of the university council together with the other organs, the departments, the members and relatives. It consists of the President, the Vice-President for Studies and Teaching, the Vice-President for Scientific Infrastructure, Research and the Chancellor

DEANERIES AND FACULTY COUNCILS

The departmental councils are the elected committees in the departments. They decide on courses of study, teaching content, professors and other personnel issues. The Dean's offices consist of the Dean, the Vice Dean and the Dean of Studies. The dean is the chairman of the faculty council.

EXAMINATION BOARDS

The examination committees organize the implementation of the examinations, take care of spatial planning, set the examination dates and ensure that the legal framework is observed.

TECHNICAL LANGUAGE CERTIFICATE

Advanced students can obtain a technical language certificate in English (C1) and French/Spanish (B2) in various subject areas; can be upgraded to an international certificate.

SELF-STUDY CENTRE (SLZ)

About 100 study spaces are currently available for Frankfurt UAS students in the Self-Study Centre (SLZ), which is located on the first floor of the City-Gate high-rise building. The SLZ has workrooms of various sizes, including quiet rooms for individual work on theses and undisturbed study. In addition, a photocopier, an A3 scanner and a PC pool are available. Current information on the use of the SLZ under pandemic conditions is available on the website. Current events can also be found there, such as the TalkBar, which offers moderated webinars on topics related to studying during the lecture period.

LEARNING COUNSELLING FOR STUDENTS AT THE SLZ

The Self-Centre has been organising learning counselling services for years. These are currently mainly in the form of online counselling. Students have the opportunity to be coached free of charge by a learning counsellor on how to optimise their own study and learning success. Typical topics in the individual coaching sessions are time management, learning strategies, motivation and reflection. Coaching is possible as a single appointment up to support over the entire semester with the completion of exams. Open office hours for this learning counselling are Thursdays from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. in room 234 in City Gate, as well as other appointments by appointment at lernberatung@fra-uas.de.

NOW ONLINE: SCRUM METHOD

The support and guidance of learning groups with the help of the SCRUM method is now also available online. Interested learning groups register for an initial appointment with the learning counselling service. In this appointment, the further procedure of the learning group is outlined until the learning goal is reached. In accompanying appointments during the semester, feedback is given on where the learning group stands with its learning goal. This offer of the agile learning method is particularly suitable for learning groups that stay together for a whole semester and do not want to lose sight of their learning motivation. LIBRARY

The library serves as the university's central service facility for providing literature and information to students and staff. It supports studies, teaching and research by providing specialist literature, promoting information literacy and also serves as a place of lear-

UNIVERSITY SERVICES

LITERATURE STOCK

The library offers around 210,000 volumes of printed literature for lending and on-site use. An increasing proportion of media is provided in digital form, currently around 80,000 e-books, e-journals and databases. These are also available to you from home via VPN.

STUDY AND WORK ROOMS

In the library rooms you will find numerous individual workstations for quiet reading and studying as well as a number of group rooms.

SERVICES

At the information desk you can get help with literature research and the use of e-books. e-journals or databases. In addition, the library offers a research consultation via Zoom Tues - Thurs from 11 am - 12 pm. If necessary, e.g. if you have a term paper or thesis due, uou can also make individual appointments either via Zoom or - if possible - on site. In addition,

the library offers research training for groups of 5 or more. You can use the Citavi programme for literature management and knowledge organisation when writing your academic term papers and theses. The library regularly offers introductory courses for this. You can also find self-study tutorials on Citavi in Mondle

SCANNING, PRINTING AND INTERNET ACCESS

The library has a PC pool with internet access, a printing station and photocopiers. In addition, there are two book scanners on which documents up to A2 can be scanned free of charge.

EQUALITY

ANTI-DISCRIMINATION

At Frankfurt University of Applied Sciences, fairness and appreciation in dealing with each other should become a matter of principle. Therefore, Frankfurt UAS is committed to taking action against any form of discrimination and boundary crossing.

At the end of 2017, the Frankfurt UAS Anti-Discrimination Policu was adopted. For the first time, the policy establishes a procedure for protecting against and dealing with discrimination, sexual harassment and violence, stalking and bullying.

This procedure includes low-threshold counseling and support for those affected in cases of discrimination by initial counselors at the university, as well as the procedure for a complaint procedure according to the German Anti-Discrimination Act (AGG). Such a complaint, which entails a legal examination and can have consequences for the accused persons, is addressed to the university management. Before a formal complaint procedure is initiated, the person concerned should first seek advice from an internal initial counseling centre service.

INITIAL COUNSELLING CENTRES

The initial counselling service offered by the Anti-Discrimination Office is addressed to all university members who have experienced or observed discrimination. In principle, those seeking advice (irrespective of the type of discrimination) are free to choose which initial counsellor they contact. The first counsellors are active in different areas and different functions at the university and may provide counselling on different focal points and with diverse backgrounds.

For those affected by and witnessing discrimination, sexual harassment, violence, stalking or bullying, the initial counselling offers low-threshold initial support. The counselling is oriented towards the concerns and perspectives of the person seeking advice. In addition to counselling, initial counsellors can, for example, arrange and/or accompany further talks or initiate a complaint procedure. Initial counselling takes place in a confidential setting and nothing is done against the will of the person seeking counselling.

ANTI-DISCRIMINATION COUNCIL

The Anti-Discrimination Council is the point of contact for all questions relating to anti-discrimination at the university. The task of the Anti-Discrimination Council is to develop preventive measures and to support the initial counselling Centres with conceptual considerations and evaluations. Other areas of work include advising the Presidential Board, raising awareness among the university public, developing recommendations and evaluating and further developing the anti-discrimination guideline.

NURSERY

The "Campus Kids" nursery consists of two groups with places for 22 children between the ages of three months and three years.

The aim is to support the development of every child, regardless of origin, gender, aptitude and social background.

We incorporate the model of free movement development and relational care according to Emmi Pikler into our work. The basis for this is the settling-in period with the parents. As a stable caregiver in the facility, the teacher radiates security and protection for the child.

A positive attitude gives the children room to develop and strengthens their self-confidence.

Continuous close contact with the parents is important to us during the care of the children. We usually offer visits to the crèche every third Tuesday of the month. Registration is done via the family office.



COUNSELING CENTRE FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES, IMPAIRMENTS, CHRONIC-SOMATIC OR MENTAL ILL-NESSES

Counselling and support for students with disabilities/impairments is a service offered by Frankfurt UAS that ensures the implementation of Article 24 (paragraph 5) of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities. EXAM ADMINISTRATION QIS-HIS PORTAL

With the QIS-Portal (QIS = Quality Improvement of University Administration on the Internet, through self-service), students at the Frankfurt UAS have the opportunity to perform functions such as semester re-registration, address changes, printing of certificates and, of course, exam registration and deregistration via the Internet.

WHERE CAN I FIND THE QIS-HIS PORTAL?

You can log into the QIS-HIS Portal from any computer: his.frankfurt-university.de/

WHERE DO I GET MY ACCESS DATA?

To log in to the HIS you need an identification (matriculation number) and the initialisation password, which you can change later. When you enrolled, you received your study chip and the access data for the self-service stations (building 1, ground floor, desk terminal). There you log in with the study chip and receive the HIS initialisation password, which you can now use to log in to the QIS-HIS portal via the internet for the first time

EXAM ADMINISTRATION

In addition to registering for and deregistering from exams, this area also contains the grade list. This function gives you an overview of the examinations you have taken so far. Passes and failures are displayed. In addition, you have the option of downloading examination certificates and your grade list as a PDF in order to print them out afterwards.

STUDY ADMINISTRATION

E-LEARNING

STUDENTS IN QUALITY MANAGEMENT

For Frankfurt UAS, its students are the Centre of interest. We offer practice-oriented academic studies and support all committed and motivated students to the best of our ability in successfully completing them. The quality of our degree programmes is very important to us and you as a student can get involved here in many ways.

- Course evaluation: During the lecture period, you can evaluate courses using a standardised questionnaire. Your department decides when each course is to be evaluated. The completed questionnaires should be placed in a sealed envelope, preferably by a participating student, and thrown into one of the collection bins provided. Our evaluation service evaluates the survey and sends the results to the teacher within 48 hours. Teachers are obliged to discuss the results with their students.
- Round tables and focus groups on programme development: At least every three to four semesters, students are systematically asked about the quality of their programme. In some departments, these discussions take place together with the programme directors and the teaching staff; in other departments, the quality management officers (QMB) only talk to students and pass on their feedback to the programme directors and the teaching staff. The results of these rounds flow into the continuous further development of the study programme.
- Graduation survey: If you are about to graduate, you will be given the opportunity to evaluate your studies and your degree programme with a standardised questionnaire. We look forward to your feedback, for example on the structure, equipment, individual modules and reasons for study delays, as well as your suggestions for improvement!
- Graduates: About a year after your graduation, we will contact you by e-mail and post to find out about your further career. Please provide us with a private e-mail address when you enrol so that we can contact you. We know from these surveys that our graduates generally have excellent job prospects.

If the study chip is no longer readable or defective, the student will receive a replacement for € 1.

EXAM REGULATIONS

The Prüfungsordnung (exam regulations, PO for short) is the most important document for your degree programme.

It contains the content and organisational details of the degree programmes - and is binding. In addition to the PO, there are the "Allgemeine Bestimmungen" (General Regulations), which regulate fundamental matters that apply to the entire university.

FINDING ACCOMMODATION

An affordable roof over your head is an important prerequisite for successful studies. In Frankfurt, however, suitable living space for students is scarce. It is more difficult than in many other German university cities to find a suitable room or flat


RÖMERBERG
